

ALEXANDRU CRISTIAN MADGEARU is scientific researcher of rank I in the sector of military history, bureau of modern history. He graduated at the Faculty of History-Philosophy of the Bucharest University (1988). Doctor in history, University of Bucharest (1997).

History school teacher (1988-1991). Employed on 1st December 1991 as research assistant in the Institute for History and Military History.

Fulbright post-doctoral fellowship (Ohio State University 2002-2003). The „Dimitre Onciul” Prize of the Romanian Academy (2016).

Member in the Commission for Heraldry and Names of the Ministry of National Defence. Member of the executive committee of the Romanian Society for Byzantine Studies.

His main research fields are: the history and archaeology of the Late Antiquity and of the Middle Ages in the South-East European region; the political and military history of the Byzantine Empire; the Romanian modern military history.

He published 16 books, among whom 2 at Brill (Leiden) and 1 at Scarecrow Press (Lanham), as well as circa 140 studies in scientific journals and collective volumes in Romania and abroad, since 1986. He presented papers at the international congresses for South-East European and Byzantine studies, and at various internal and external conferences. He contributed to the edition of the series of volumes of documents dedicated to the participation of Romania at World War I.
