

Andreea – Iuliana Bădilă is a scientific researcher in the field of military history at the Institute for Political Studies of Defence and Military History, Ministry of National Defence, Romania, since 2023.

She holds a PhD in history, title obtained at the Faculty of History of the University of Bucharest, with the thesis "Romanian Diplomatic Actions in the UN and CSCE. A comparative analysis (1962-1975)", and also a graduate of the Master's Degree "Romania in the 20th century" and of the Bachelor's program in contemporary history of Romania, both at the same faculty.

During her PhD studies and later she delivered various seminars at the Faculty of History of the University of Bucharest covering topics such as foreign and domestic policy of Romania in the 20th century, military history and communism.

Her areas of interests are the foreign policy of Romania and international relations in the 20th century, human rights, opposition and repression under the communist regime, security and defence within international organizations in the dynamics of the Cold War, the Romanian Revolution of December 1989.

She published a series of studies and articles in specialized journals dealing with foreign policy of Romania and repression during the communist regime.

She is the author of the book "Human Rights in the «Golden Age». Securitate's Documents", 2019; coordinated together with professor Constantin Hlihor of two volumes "Revolution and Transition in Contemporary Romanian Society. Interdisciplinary Approaches", 2017, 2019, and co-author in the volume „The Fall of Dictator. Hybrid War and Disinformation during the Romanian Revolution File”, 2022, coordinated by Andrei Ursu and Roland O. Thomasson.
